

I say hello to my friend. He doesn't reply.	I might feel: • ignored • sad • not welcome
My friend says hello to me. I say hello back to my friend.	My friend might feel: • happy • liked
My friends says hello to me. I don't reply.	My friend might feel: • hurt • ignored

Practice: Take a field trip. Plan the field trip so that adults and children are in place to greet the student. This could be in the hallway, around the neighborhood, on the playground, visiting another classroom, etc. Upon being greeted, prompt the student to reply as needed. Fade the prompt as the student replies independently.
